**Scripture- Galatians 6:9**

*"Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."*

### **Devotional Reflection**

One of the greatest challenges in spiritual growth is not starting the journey — it is continuing it. Many people begin with enthusiasm. They pray consistently for a few days, start new spiritual habits, and feel energized by fresh insight from God's Word. Yet as time passes and life becomes busy, that early excitement can begin to fade.

Paul speaks directly into this reality in Galatians 6:9. He encourages believers not to grow weary in doing good. His words remind us that faithfulness sometimes requires endurance. Spiritual growth often unfolds gradually, and the harvest God promises does not always appear immediately.

God rarely forms transformation through instant change. Instead, He develops character through steady obedience and repeated alignment with truth. Each moment you choose patience over frustration, humility over pride, forgiveness over resentment, or trust over worry strengthens something inside you.

Just like seeds planted in the ground require time before they produce fruit, the spiritual practices you are cultivating today are developing something beneath the surface. God is forming habits, shaping character, and strengthening your foundation in ways that may not yet be visible.

The harvest will come, but it grows through persistence. Today is an invitation to stay faithful in the process. The small steps you take with God today are preparing the fruit you will see tomorrow.
